

Late 1960s: start of pedestrianisation of the city centre streets

1987: 2nd most modern tramway in France goes into service

2004: Launch of Métrovélo, which has since become the leading public bicycle rental service in France (fleet of 9,000 bikes!)

Some KEY dates

2005: Implementation of the first climate plan in France at local level (extended to air quality in 2012, then climate air energy plan in 2016)

2009: Caserne de Bonne, France's first eco-district (awardwinning)

2016: first major city in France to introduce a 30 km/h speed limit, and the largest "ZFE" (Low Emissions Zone) in France (27 municipalities in the metropolis)



2017: first tracks of the Chronovélo network

(Today, a network of 49 km and almost 500 km of cycle paths, the leading cycling city in France according to the Federation of Bicycle Users)



2019 : launch of an ambitious food waste composting plan

(the first of this scale in a metropolis) (Compost first, and also Biogas since 2021)





But also... Greening of schoolyards, tree planting, canopy plan....



Outstanding buildings: Hautbois (High-boe – Oboe), ABC....





Production of green energy (Gaz et Electricité de Grenoble -GEG, Participatory democracy (Participatory Budget, Citizen's Climate Convention)
